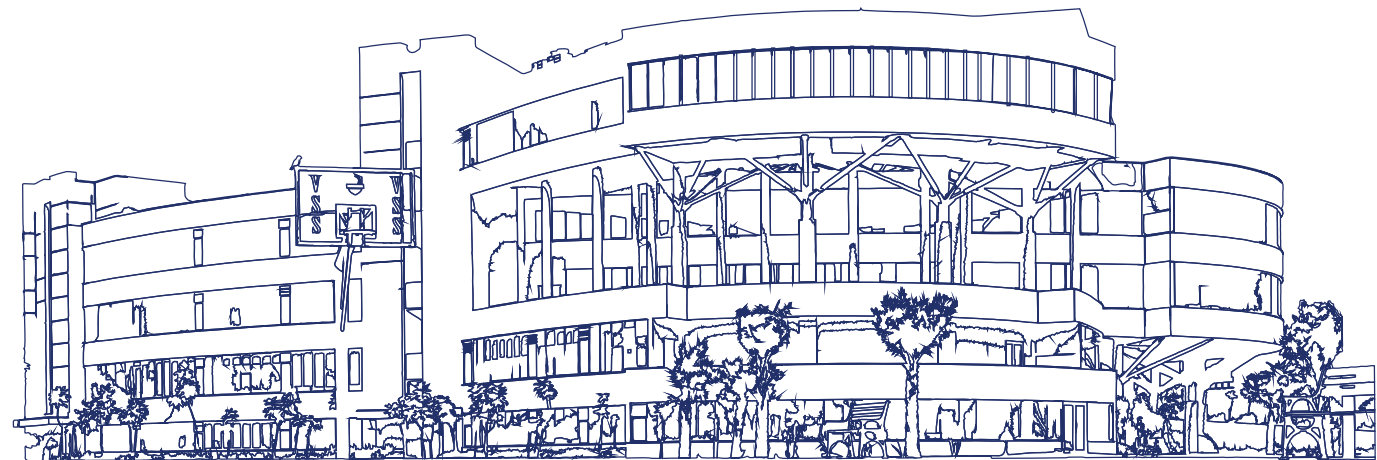

The school takes this learning a notch higher and expands the child's horizon with respect to knowledge. However, a boarding school offers a unique environment that seamlessly blends both home and school to accelerate learning and raise self-assured, confident, resilient, and yet compassionate young adults.

VSS offers an untamed exposure to independence and a brush with reality and practicality, as well as friendships and bonds that continue well beyond the school years.

We have a mentorship programme in place that allows the mentor to interact with their mentees assisting in mental, physical and emotional development including keeping an eye on their academics. After classes, boarder students are exposed to a multitude of activities that ensures a rounded education be it in academic or sports, arts, music etc. Children can pursue their passion without hindering their academics as it is school-mandated. These students make friends for life. They look back at their years in school as a time when lasting friendships were established. Along with this is the network of friends and acquaintances they build who know and care for them. Being surrounded by people who encourage and support them is something that only a boarding environment facilitates. The bond established during this period transcends all other relationships.

Boarding Life: Statement of Boarding Principles & Practice Boarding

- The goal of Boarding life at Venkateshwar Signature School is to provide an atmosphere and ethos in which "*understanding, peace, tolerance, equality of sexes, and friendship among all people, ethnic, national, and religious groups, and persons of indigenous origin*" prevail at all times and in all contexts.
- All boarding students live in one of two Houses that are close to one another and can be reached on foot.
- Based on the developmental stage of the students dwelling at each site, all boarding rules and regulations are established.
- The school releases comprehensive rules for behavior management. However, a restorative justice system is used for minor transgressions and conflicts.
- Whole Campus has wireless Internet access, with time restrictions based on school level and age.
- On working days, there is daily 1 ½ (one-and-a-half) hours evening Compulsory Study Time.
- Each house has a system in place for daily room cleanliness, and hygiene inspections.

Code of Conduct

Venkateshwar Signature School is committed to developing a positive and adaptive behaviour that enables students to deal effectively with the demands and challenges of everyday life. However, any kind of disruptive activities are unacceptable. The following wrong practices will lead to strict disciplinary action:

1. Disfiguring or damaging school property.
2. Scribbling or writing on the walls / furniture or uniform.
3. Damaging, scribbling or tearing of pages from library books, texts or exercise books.
4. Bringing sharp and injury causing articles such as knives, blades etc.
5. Bringing books, CDs, etc. not relevant to their course work.
6. Bringing costly articles like expensive watches, cameras, fountain pens, cell phones etc.
7. Bullying or using any form of violence against a fellow student and using abusive language.
8. Bursting crackers or throwing colour on one another within or near the school premises.
9. Late arrival in school.
10. Misconduct, indiscipline and misbehavior in school buses.
11. Driving without a valid license.

The following disciplinary measures may be adopted, if necessary:

- (A) Verbal warning and counselling
- (B) Written warning
- (C) Suspension/expulsion in extreme cases

Attendance

Coming to school regularly is an integral part of a student's life. This inculcates discipline and regularity in a student which in turn creates a value system, an essential part of his/her life. There is no substitute for the holistic education gained by a child in the school environment. No student will be allowed to enter class without a leave application if he/she has been absent the previous day. Prior intimation is necessary for leave.

Leave of absence

1. Students who have been sick for more than five days must bring a medical certificate from their doctor on rejoining the school.
2. It is compulsory for all students to maintain at least 75% attendance during the course of the academic session, to enable them to appear for the final examination.
3. No half day leave for any reason, except in grave emergency, shall be granted.

ASSESSMENTS PATTERN

Assessment is an integral part of the learning process as it gauges the consistent progress made by the child throughout the academic session.

FOUNDATIONAL CLASSES

Promotion to the next class is based on continuous assessment i.e. child's everyday performance, quality of work, assimilation of the concepts taught, participation in class and co-curricular activities.

Skills in different areas will be assessed and graded on a 5-point scale.

PREPARATORY CLASSES III- V

- Skills in different areas will be assessed and graded on a 5- point scale.
- Academic session will be divided into two terms. In each term assessment of 50marks in each subject.

MIDDLE CLASSES VI -VIII

- The academic session will be divided into two terms and will be assessed out of 100 marks in each term.
- In each term, in each subject, there will be an end-of-term written exam for 80marks and Periodic Test for 10 marks and Multiple Assessments for 10 Marks.

SECONDARY CLASSES IX-XII

- Annual Examination for class IX and Board Examination for class X will be conducted at the end of the academic session for 80 marks in each subject covering the syllabus of the whole year.
- A student has to secure 33% marks in each subject to be declared passed.
- Internal Assessment for 20 marks in each subject will be conducted as follows

PROMOTION POLICY FOR CLASS - XI

- A student will be treated as passed and promoted to class XII if he/she qualifies in all five subjects in class XI.
- To qualify in a subject a student has to secure (separately in Theory and Practical) at least 33% in both of the followings:
 - Annual Examination Marks
 - Cumulative Marks (20% of PT + 30% of SA1 + 50% of SA2)
- If a student fails to qualify in only one subject he/she is placed in compartment in that subject. In that case, SA2 marks will be replaced by the Compartment Examination marks and then the criterion stated in point 2 will be applied for promotion.
- If a student fails to qualify in more than one subject he/she will be detained in class XI.
- The Compartment Examination will be held after a minimum of 10 days from the result declaration day.

Results of students will be withheld under the following conditions:

- Non clearance of fee till the deadline of the end of financial year.
- Library books not returned.
- Non clearance of dues towards Science/Mathematics/Social Science/Computer Labs
- Attendance is below 75%

Payment of Fee

Term Fee should be paid as per the following schedule:

- 31st of March 2025 - For the 1st Term from 1st April to 30th June 2025.
- 30th of June 2025 - For the 2nd Term from 1st July to 30th September 2025.
- 30th of September 2025 - For the 3rd Term from 1st October to 31st December 2025.
- 31st of December 2025 - For the 4th Term from 1st January to 31st March 2026.
- Grace period of one month may be given to those who fail to pay the fees on time. Further delay in fees payment will entail Rs. 100/- per day charged as fine.
- If the outstanding amount is not cleared after two months (60 days) from the scheduled date as mentioned above, the concerned student's name will be struck off from the school roll and a sum of Rs. 3000/- as re-admission fees shall be charged in addition to the outstanding amount.

School Transport

- School buses will stop only at the designated points.
- Buses will not wait for late-comers.
- Students are advised not to spill eatables into the bus and not to discard trash inside / outside the bus.
- No one should board / leave the bus till it takes a complete halt.
- Unruly behavior inside the bus will amount to strict disciplinary action.
- A month's notice in writing or a month's fee in lieu of notice should be given before a child discontinues availing the bus services.

School Publication

A newsletter **Hastakshar** (हस्ताक्षर) is published quarterly, which highlights the Scholastic and Co-scholastic activities at school and has the achievements and creative efforts of the students.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

- All students must wear the complete prescribed school uniform.
- Oversized uniforms with extra-long sleeves or drooping shoulder as well as extra-long trousers are strictly not allowed as they mar the appearance of the child.
- Wearing of uniform is must when going out for picnics and organized tours.

- Girls are not permitted to wear fancy clips, bangles and other jewellery items to school.
- Students from VI onwards can wear simple black dial, inexpensive watches to school.

5. Parents are requested to bring their ward's Almanac during PTMs for registering their presence in it.
6. Any urgent message may be communicated at the school reception telephonically. Phone calls from parents for any teacher or student during the school hours will not be entertained.
7. Parents are requested to switch off their mobile phone in school premises .
8. Parents who make independent transport arrangements for their ward by hiring private vehicles will be fully responsible for the same. They must ensure that proper verification of drivers is done and all safety measures are taken to avoid any untoward incident.
9. Parents are requested to sign the reports, test papers, teacher's remarks in the notebooks/school almanac so that they are abreast with the progress of their child. They are also requested to visit the teachers whenever called or on PTMs and orientation programs.
10. Please do not send your child to school if he/she is feeling unwell. A proper application or Medical Leave must be submitted in writing by the parents.
11. Apart from the academic scholastic/ co-scholastic work in the school, students are expected to devote some time regularly at home. Parents are requested to supervise it.
12. Parents should carry out their responsibilities as joint educators in instilling values in their children and strict adherence to all school rules.

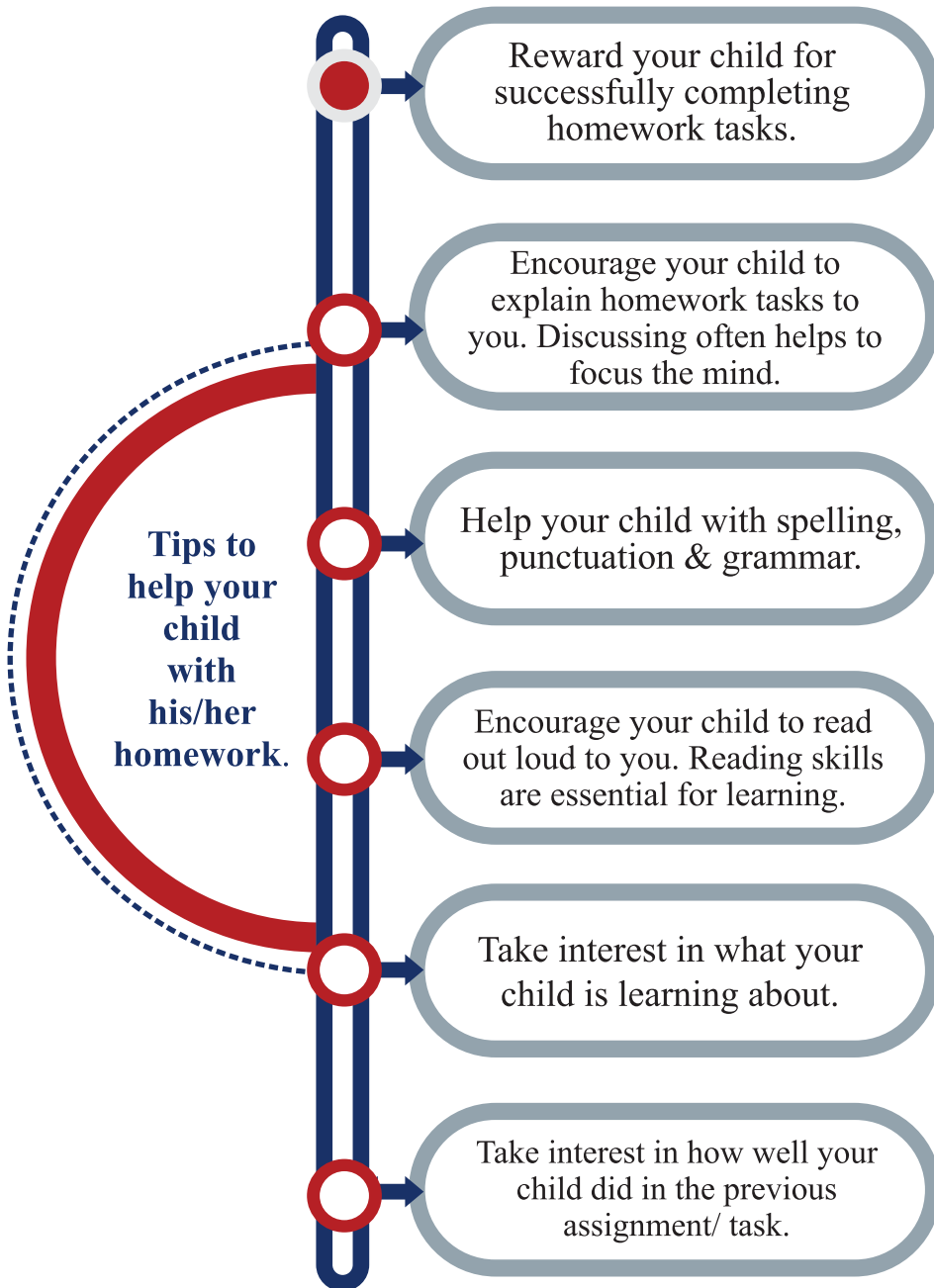

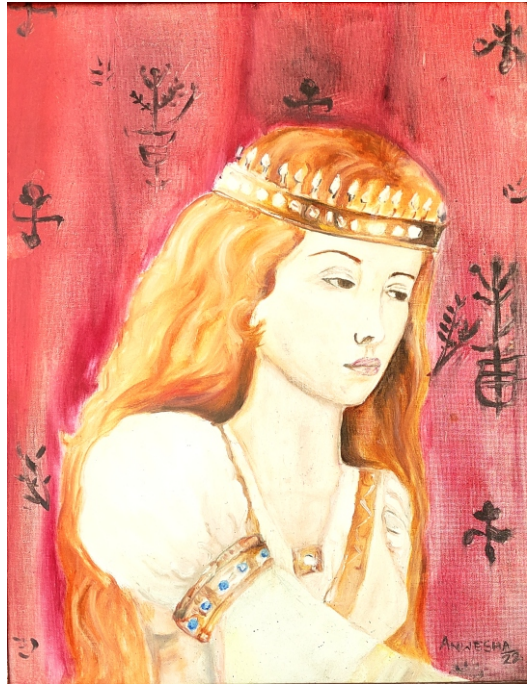
